must include a minimum of 30 hours, and doctoral programs must include a minimum of 30 hours beyond the master's.

⁴ When a department/school or dean proposes closing a program, approval routing follows the typical process beginning with the department/school. An administrative proposal by the provost or senior vice president for academic affairs would follow the "provost-proposed" routing on the chart.

Admission Requirements

~~While the Standard Program accepts students~~ To be accepted into the MSSW Program under the Standard degree plan, students must have ~~with~~ a bachelor's degree in any field. Students are expected to demonstrate a broad liberal arts background, including two courses from each of the following areas: science/math, social/behavioral sciences, humanities/fine arts, and communication/language. To see if a specific course qualifies for the liberal arts background requirement, please contact the School of Social Work ~~office~~. ~~A course in statistics is highly desirable.~~

To be accepted into the MSSW Program under the Advanced Standing degree plan, students must have a bachelor's degree in social work from a CSWE-accredited institution. Applicants who completed the BSW more than five years ago are eligible for Advanced Standing only if they are employed in the field of social services or hold a current social work licensure.

Students interested in applying for the ACU MSSW Standard or Advanced Standing Degree are required to submit the following documents:

~~Admission requirements for any graduate program in the School of Social Work are:~~

1. A completed application for admission with a nonrefundable application fee;
2. An official transcript(s) in English (or translated to English) of all previous colleges attended. The transcript must indicate an earned bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university or equivalent;
3. A cumulative undergraduate GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. If undergraduate GPA is below 3.0, the GRE or MAT entrance exam may be required;
4. ~~Two letters of recommendation;~~ Three letters of recommendation;
 - Students applying to the Standard degree plan must have two of the three references represent people who can speak to the student's academic and/or professional behavior abilities, including but not limited to a faculty member, program director, internship supervisor, etc.
 - Students applying to the Advanced Standing degree plan must have two of the three references represent people who can speak to the student's abilities as an emerging social worker. Of the two academic references, at least one must be a program director, practicum director, or practicum instructor/supervisor.
5. A ~~writing sample, which must be a~~ personal statement addressing your motivation for graduate studies and entering the social work profession, and reflections on the ~~following social work-related~~ program's four themes: ~~evidence-based practice, diversity, spirituality and holistic well-being, and social justice~~ of human rights and justice, cultural and spiritual humility, holistic practice, and empowerment.
6. Standard Degree Plan Only: A ~~second~~ writing sample in the form of a formal graded (returned with feedback) upper-level assignment of at least five pages from the student's undergraduate work (or acceptable alternative). Questions on this assignment may be directed to the School of Social Work if additional information is needed.
7. Advanced Standing Plan Only: A ~~field-final BSW/BSSW-practicum assessment evaluation. must be submitted by students who have graduated from a CSWE accredited BSW/BSSW program and are applying for Advanced Standing status (1 year program).~~
 - If the student's practicum experience is still in progress, they may submit a midterm practicum evaluation for admission decision review. If admitted, the final

practicum evaluation is required prior to enrolling in classes or applying to the Practicum Program.

8. A video conference interview with the program director may be requested.

~~Applications for the Standard Program are accepted for fall admission. Advanced Standing students with a recent BSW degree from a program accredited by the CSWE are admitted in June. Applications received by February 16 will receive early review, priority for scholarships, graduate assistantships and field practicum sites. Part-time students may be accepted on a rolling basis.
