Please forgive this impersonal address. On behalf of my colleagues on the ASCH Program Committee I wish to let you know that your panel has been accepted for the 2014 winter meeting in Washington. We had to assess some fifty full panel submissions and more than one hundred individual paper submissions. The AHA only allows us about thirty-five panels so competition for slots was fierce. Congratulations are in order for your fine submission.

I should also note here that although the AHA has traditionally gives us the same slots each year, there is always the slightest possibility that the number will be reduced. We delayed in sending out the acceptances, in part, because we were hoping for absolute confirmation from them, which we still have not received. In the unlikely event that something is different this year, we will let you know, but we do not foresee that occurrence.
