In the case of three-paper panels, SHA sessions normally allow a maximum of twenty minutes for each paper, ten minutes for the comment and twenty minutes for discussion. Papers, complete with footnotes or endnotes, should be submitted in the final form in which they will be presented orally, to both the commentator and the chair at least one month in advance of the conference. Please let me know of any editorial changes in presenter's status, paper titles, etc.

The SHA requires program participants to become members. If you are not already a member of the European History Section or a full member of the SHA, please use the enclosed membership form to join. The acceptance of your paper for presentation at the 77th annual meeting in Baltimore remains provisional until your 2011 membership form and check for the modest 2011 dues have been received.
