Approval of minutes from 10.28.11

Motion to approve; seconded; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes.

Core Revisions

G. Straughn spoke about the consolidation of CORE 120/220 into a single 3-hour course. Students that entered Fall 2010 will have completed all three courses. Total CORE hours will still be 56. Content will come through the council at a later date.

Motion to approve the consolidation; seconded; no further discussion; 6 in favor; 1 opposed; 1 abstain; motion passes.

Proposal to consolidate CORE 320 and BIBL 440 into a single 3-hour course.

Motion to approve the consolidation of CORE 320 and BIBL 440; seconded; no further discussion; 8 in favor; none opposed; 1 abstain; motion passes.

Proposal to reduce Cornerstone from 3 credit hours to 2 credit hours. This will still carry a 3 hour faculty load.

Motion to approve reducing Cornerstone from a 3 hour credit course to a 2 credit hour course that carries a 3 hour faculty load; seconded; all in favor; none abstain; motion passes.

BMIS 391-New Course Application
