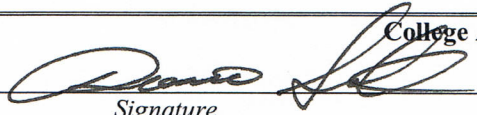

Comment [MDS3]: Move SOCI 350, 362, and 480 into a menu of advanced hours in sociology.

Comment [MDS4]: Drop SOCI 442 – Cultural Diversity – Same material is taught in SOCW 329. SOCW 329 - Diversity, Power and Oppression - will be included in the list of advanced hours that students can choose from.

Comment [MDS5]: Drop SOCI 460 – Ethics and Social Issues. The content of this course is very similar to BIBD 486. BIBD 486 will be added to the degree plan.

Comment [MDS6]: Move SOCI 480 into the menu of advanced hours in sociology.
