- I. Prayer was led by K. Cha
- II. Call to order by S. Lewis
We will have more time this year to focus on broader topics.
- III. Approval of Minutes from May 1, 2013
D. Pope mentioned that some of the items have not been included in the catalog.
Motion to approve by Pope; seconded by Riggs; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes
- IV. JMC 100 – Proposal to the Social Science Menu
This course was presented by C. Bacon. The course was approved by the UGEC and tabled by the UUAC in April, 2012 with the request to me made clearer.
Motion to approve by Brokaw; seconded by Pemberton; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes

(At this time C. Bacon, D Mendenhall and K. Cha leave)

- V. KINE 301 – New Course Proposal
This course as well as 303, and 401 were presented by O. Wright. T. Baggs asked what the overlap was between 301 and 303. Wright stated the differences being, 301 focuses on keeping people safe, while 303 focuses on the law and legal side of management. Brokaw stated that Wright needs to use verbs that better relate to Bloom's Taxonomy of Learning.
Motion to approve by Pemberton; seconded by Pope; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes
- VI. KINE 303 – New Course Proposal

O. Wright points out that he will fix the mistake at the beginning on the form per Brokaw's request. Pope mentions the wording issue again.

Motion to approve by Pope; seconded by Brokaw, Atkinson; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes

VII. KINE 401 – New course Proposal

M. Atkinson asked why the library memo was included in one of the other proposals but left out of 401. An amended motion was placed by Brokaw to approve and wait on the library memo. Pemberton seconded his motion.

Motion to approve Brokaw; seconded by Pemberton; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes

VIII. KINE 485 –New Course Proposal

This course was presented by Matt Garver. E. Gumm asked if there was a reason 474 wasn't chosen, he believes it would bring more clarity to students. M. Garver said that he was given 485 but is open to changing the number.

Motion passes, number may change.

Motion to approve by Pemberton ; seconded by Williams; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes

IX. KINE 490 - Curriculum Changes

Information Item. This change was presented by Joe Bell. The current title is being changed to Special Populations because it is more appropriate for the KSRM field and better describes the course. MGMT 330 is also being removed from the degree.

Motion to approve by Pope; seconded by Williams; all in favor; none opposed; motion passes

X. BA – DBMM

Chris Hutson presented this proposal. This is only a discussion item, not yet being voted on.

Pemberton asked if the 50% off applied to grad school and if the cost would be greater for them and stressed that students need to know the cost. Hutson said most students are getting 60-100% off and it is unlikely to get less than 50% off. Grad school offers 5-6 scholarship in the GST and those students will most likely have greater offers. Pemberton stated that we do want this to bring in more students but if we do not have the scholarships available there will be a problem. Hutson agreed it would be difficult unless we have more endowed scholarships.

There was discussion that during the overlap year students may be able to use undergraduate scholarships. T. Milholland suggested that it would be good to add this to the document – SACS policies 3.4.5 and 3.4.6. 3.6.1, 2, 3 and 4 are criteria for the graduate degree. Hutson advises rather than the form saying 24 hours for the double dip, instead say 1 year, meaning more hours, maybe 30 hours.

Hutson stated that if ACU will accept hours from dental school and apply them to a degree we should be able to do the same. This is a good opportunity to have more to offer students since we have competition with other universities.
