We wish to add the Global Studies courses numbered GLST 212, 214, and 217 to the menu of selections for the GLST minor. These courses are offered in our three hub study abroad campuses. They were given these permanent catalog numbers in 2013, but we failed to explicitly list them among selections for the GLST minor. Thus, students who study abroad for full semesters are constantly asking how their Global Studies course might substitute.

- Add GLST 212, 214, 217 to the Global Structures menu

In addition:

- move BMIS 245 from Global Selections to Global Structures menu
- move GEOG 354 from Global Structures to Global Selections menu (to help ensure students who take courses from this menu will meet the requirement for 2 upper-level courses)
- remove POLS 227 from Global Selections menu (as it is already in Global Structures)

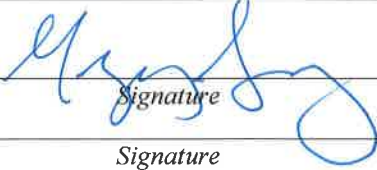
