The Biology faculty has voted to close the Biology/Business (BIOB) track of the Biology BS degree as part of a larger overhaul of the major. The track currently has one student enrolled, and he has begun the process of changing his major (unrelated to this proposal).

I have attached the department's proposal. They have said that they would encourage their students who had interest in both fields to major in biology and minor in business.

The number of students in the major means that this should not affect your ACCT 210, FIN 310, MGMT 330, MKTG 320, or MKTG 343 classes. However, I wanted COBA to be aware before the proposal goes to UUAC.
