³ All courses that meet University Requirements for general education must go through UGEC. Courses or degrees offered only to students seeking teacher certification must go through the Teacher Education Council. All undergraduate changes must go before the UUAC. All graduate degree plan changes must go through the Graduate Council.

⁴ A minimum of 30 hours is required for a major. A maximum is specified for each degree (e.g., BA, BS). The university minimum for elective hours is 6, unless the requirements of external accrediting bodies make it impossible.

⁵ Program or course changes that apply to any major that includes Teacher Certification will be reviewed by the college, the Teacher Education Council (TEC), and then the UUAC.

⁶ Courses that satisfy ACU's University Requirements (General Education) will normally have lower-level numbering, be free of prerequisites and co-requisites, appeal to more than one or two majors, and "not narrowly focus on those skills, techniques, and procedures specific to a particular occupation or profession" (SACS 2.7.3). Departments may request exceptions to the first three criteria.

Summary of Planned Changes to MGMT Degree

The Griggs Center is proposing a curriculum update to introduce a new minor and certificate in entrepreneurship. As part of that plan, a new set of entrepreneurship core courses is being introduced and some existing courses are being modified. Additional details about the rationale, justification, and overall curriculum plan can be found in the application for the new minor and certificate.

The MGMT major currently includes an Entrepreneurship and Philanthropy concentration, which is one of four options available to students. We propose this concentration be updated to mirror the structure of the new minor and certificate. A sample, revised degree plan is included below. This is based on the 2020-21 catalog available on ACU's website. The suggested changes are highlighted in yellow.

In addition to course updates, we are adding a new requirement for students to participate in co-curricular experiences offered by the Griggs Center. Similar to other programs with non-curricular requirements, this has been added under "Other Graduation Requirements" at the end of the degree plan.

We are also changing the name of the concentration to Entrepreneurship as the philanthropy-based course will no longer be included in the menu of entrepreneurship electives.

Changes to the Business Foundations section of the degree plans for the ACCT, FIN, MKTG and MGMT are also being proposed but are included in a separate approval request. For consistency, these proposed changes are reflected in the sample degree plan below and are also highlighted in yellow.
