Courses that were approved by ACU Abilene departments, colleges, and councils are identified for inclusion in ACU Dallas programs. ACU Dallas adopts these previously approved courses, along with their course descriptions and student learning outcomes, as new courses and cross-lists them with the original course.

The course listed below has been identified for use in ACU Dallas programs and for approval for adoption and cross-listing.

HIST 250

- Course Title: Introduction to American Ethnic and Women's Studies
- Credit Hours: 3
- Course Description: This course is designed as an essential element for the minor in Ethnic and Women's studies. It is the required introductory survey for the minor. It can also fulfill a core social science or cultural awareness requirement or elective requirement depending on your degree plan. While the course is interdisciplinary in nature, it focuses on interpretation of past practices and introduces the student to the methods of inquiry, significant research findings, and key concepts particular to the discipline of history. This course is an introductory survey, within a Christian context, of race, class, and gender in society. This course may be used to satisfy University Requirements.
- Course Outcomes
 - The student will obtain a better understanding of these issues and how they impact the individual, small groups, institutions, and societies including: definitions; historical development; their impact on religion, politics, education, the media, the workplace, crime and family life.
 - It is the intent of the instructor that this class will broaden the student's view of others by building on the Christian definition of who is our brother, sister, and neighbor, promote social activism, and strengthen the Christian attitude of servanthood.
