The following course was approved by ACU Abilene department, college, and council for inclusion in ACU Dallas programs. ACU Dallas adopts the previously approved course, along with its course description and student learning outcomes, as a new course and cross-lists them with the original course.

The course listed below has been identified for use in ACU Dallas programs and for approval for adoption and cross-listing.

HIST 131

- Course Title: World History: Cultures and Connections since 1400
- Credit Hours: 3
- Course Description: This course provides a survey of the economic, political, and cultural interactions between major world regions and civilizations from the fifteenth century to the present, with attention to major global processes and movements. May be used to satisfy University Requirements.
- Course Outcomes

The student who successfully completes this course will be able to demonstrate

- 1) an understanding of the modern world (with particular attention to the periodic intensification and contraction of global interactions)
- 2) an awareness of the relationship between economic and technological innovation, social transformations, and political ideologies and forms.
- 3) He or she should also be able to argue for the importance of global approaches to historical study.
