Content Overlap

There is no significant content overlap among the new courses or with KINE 291 Basic Sports Medicine because of the comprehensive nature of the courses and the address of different aspects of Athletic Training.

Departmental Resources

These resources include classroom space, office supplies, and office services necessary for the course.

Resources

Computers and associated technology are available in departmental classrooms. Laboratory equipment is available and can be purchased with departmental funds as needed for the course.

Expenses

Adjunct faculty pay will be required for this course at a rate of \$2350 per year. Some laboratory supplies will be purchased with departmental funds until a budget can be established for the Athletic Training program.

Justification

A New Program Application is being submitted for an athletic training concentration in KINE. This course is integral to the degree concentration and necessary to meet requirements for the student to sit for the state licensure examination for athletic training. Eighteen students are currently participating in Athletic Training courses and/or practicum hours.
